1. **Proof of Negative Coggins** required within the last 12 months (copy must accompany entry form). Original Coggins **MUST** be brought on show day. All equine exhibitors must fill out a **Self Certification of Equine Health Form** prior to unloading animals, and the form shall be presented upon request to the designated fair and show representative. Go to the Maryland Department of Agriculture website www.mda.state.md.us For current health regulations and a copy of the Equine Self-Certification Form.
2. For competitors under 18 helmets are mandatory.
3. Show is open to horses, ponies and mules.
4. There will be 8-10 obstacles per class. Obstacles which may be used are as follows: mail box, bridge, teeter totter, turnstile, as well as others.
5. We trust you will know your horse and not enter a division that is beyond their level.
6. Show management will make every effort to keep things safe so that everyone can have a safe, fun day for you and your horse.
7. Attire: If you are competing in western tack: Clean jeans, boots, button up shirt with collar (shirt may be long sleeved, short sleeved, or sleeveless), tack must be in clean safe condition, riders may wear chaps if they chose. If you are competing in english tack: tall boots, paddock boots with half chaps, or paddock boots with garter straps for juniors, polo shirt, or show shirt with collar, jackets are not required as this is a schooling event, clean and safe tack in working condition.

Leadline Division: _____ **In hand and riding will run consecutively (Champion and Reserve will be awarded. Must enter in hand and under saddle to qualify)**

1. Leadline in hand- riders must be under 9 y/o. Obstacles will be straight forward. Leadliner must lead their horse through the obstacles but can hand help walking with them.
2. Leadline under saddler - riders must be under 9 y/o. Obstacles will be straight forward, and inviting.

Green Horse: _____ **In hand and riding will run consecutively (Champion and Reserve will be awarded. Must enter in hand and under saddle to qualify)**

Obstacles may include poles, bridge, mail box, noodles

3. Green Horse in hand - Handler will lead their animal through the obstacle course.
 - a. JUNIOR Green Horse IN HAND, handler must be 18 or younger
4. Green Horse Under Saddle - Competitors will ride their horse through the obstacle course, some obstacles may be different from the in hand course.
 - a. JUNIOR Green Horse UNDER SADDLE

Rookie Division: _____ **In hand and riding will run consecutively (Champion and Reserve will be awarded. Must enter in hand and under saddle to qualify).**

Obstacles may include tarp, turnstile, barrels, teeter totter, water, may be asked to walk and trot

5. Rookie Division in Hand- Handler will lead their animal through the obstacle course.
 - a. JUNIOR Rookie IN HAND
6. Rookie Division under Saddle - Horse or pony will go through the same course mounted.
 - a. JUNIOR Rookie UNDER SADDLE

Open Division and Gambler's Choice: May be asked to WTC. NO in hand, no junior.

7. Open Division – More advanced obstacles including, lifting items, trotting, more complex maneuvers. May be asked to WTC.
8. Gambler's Choice - Riders will have set time to complete as many obstacles as possible on course. Obstacles will have points, there is no set course. The object is to accumulate the most points in the allotted time.
