RULES AND REGULATIONS

(Also See General Rules and Regulations & Health Regulations)

- Entry Fee Per Head: \$15.00 (includes \$10.00 tan bark bedding).
- Beef cattle must be on the fairgrounds by 12 Noon on opening Saturday, and must stay until 9 pm Monday and be out by 7 am on Tuesday.
- All beef cattle exhibited will be <u>unfitted</u>.
- Cattle may be clipped, washed, and blown dry only on the day of show. Exhibitors ARE allowed to use hair and skin products and conditioners (such as Revive, Kleen Sheen) as part of the regular daily grooming and hair maintenance of their beef cattle while at Howard County Fair but on show day cattle are washed and blown out only. Fly spray in the original manufacture labeled container may be used before or during the show with prior approval of the Beef Superintendents. Animals may be subject to being wiped down with a white towel, cloth, etc. as they report to the make-up area and show ring. Superintendent reserves the right to inspect the animals and make the determination.
- Cow/Calf is one entry fee. They must be the same breed. If calf is to be shown in Class 3, 4, 30 or 31, a separate entry will be required. Cow and calf must have registration papers and be of the same breed.
- Animals must be exhibited in the name of the owner(s) as displayed on the registration papers.
- There will be a commercial heifer division which will include non-papered commercial beef heifers. Commercial heifers will be shown by weight and divided into weight classes at the discretion of the Open Class Beef Superintendent. Commercial heifers must weigh in on Sunday morning August 3rd during the 4H/FFA steer weigh in.
- Exhibitors entering and exhibiting a commercial heifer must also enter and exhibit a purebred heifer or else the entries will
 not be accepted and/or the commercial heifer may not be shown.
- All group classes must be reported to Superintendent by 6 pm on Saturday, August 2nd. Prefer they be pre-entered.
- Show Order: Shorthorn, Other Breeds, Commercial, Angus and Hereford
- Premiums: \$75, \$65, \$60, \$55, \$50, \$40. Guaranteed premium of \$40.00/animal for all classes.
